



How to Care For and Clean Mattresses

People spend nearly a third of their lives sleeping, which means that mattresses are often the most used pieces of furniture in a home. All this use wears away at your mattress, leaving you with an uncomfortable night's sleep. Extend the life of your mattress and give yourself the best night's sleep possible by following the care instructions below.

General Cleaning & Care:

Do...

- Use a mattress pad as protection from stains. This will prolong the life of your mattress.
- Vacuum mattress regularly.
- Turn and rotate your mattress twice a year to help equalize the wear and tear that normally occurs.

Don't...

- Allow your mattress to get wet. Protect it from liquids.
- Use dry cleaning products on your mattress. This may cause damage to some of the material

Spot Cleaning Mattresses:

- **If your mattress becomes wet or soiled:** Blot any excess moisture using a soft cloth.
- **To clean a stain/spot:** Use mild soap with cold water and apply lightly.

Universal Cleaning Code

DC

Dry Clean Only.

E

Use a leather care kit (this includes a sponge, a cloth, leather cleaner, and leather protector cream).

N

Use a leather care kit (this includes a sponge, a cloth, leather cleaner, and leather protector cream).

N FBR

Natural Fiber Rug- Immediately blot spills to remove excess liquid with a clean white cloth or plain paper towel. Blot again with a solution of one teaspoon mild detergent with one teaspoon of white vinegar in a quart of warm water. Do not saturate.

S

Clean only with a dry cleaning solvent. Do not saturate. Do not use water. Pile fabrics may require brushing to restore appearance. Cushion covers should not be removed and dry-cleaned.

S/W

Spot clean with upholstery shampoo, foam from mild detergent, or a mild dry cleaning solvent. Do not saturate with liquid. Pile fabric may require brushing to restore appearance. Cushion covers should not be removed and dry-cleaned.

W

Clean only with water-based shampoo or foam upholstery cleaner. Do not over wet. Do not use solvents to spot clean. Pile fabric may require brushing to restore appearance. Cushion covers should not be removed and dry-cleaned.

X

Do not clean with either water or solvent-based cleaner. Use vacuuming or light brushing only.

Wool

Tuffed Wool Rugs - Blot spills up immediately with a clean white cloth or plain paper towel.
